

# Reading Dolphins Notes for teachers & parents


#### Using the book

- Begin by looking at the first story page (page 2). Look at the picture and ask questions about it. Then read the story text under the picture with your students. Use section 1 of the CD for this if possible.
- Teach and check the understanding of any new vocabulary. Note that some of the words are in the **Picture Dictionary** at the back of the book.
- Now look at the activities on the right-hand page. Show the example to the students and instruct them to complete the activities. This may be done individually, in pairs, or as a class.
- Do the same for the remaining pages of the book.
- 5 Retell the whole story more quickly, reinforcing the new vocabulary. Section 2 of the CD can help with this.
- 6 If possible, listen to the expanded story (section 3 of the CD). The students should follow in their books.
- When the book is finished, use the **Picture Dictionary** to check that students understand and remember new vocabulary. Section 4 of the CD can help with this.

#### Using the CD

- The CD contains four sections.
  - The story told slowly, with pauses. Use this during the first reading.
- It may also be used for "Listen and repeat" activities at any point.
- The story told at normal speed. This should be used once the students have read the book for the first time.
- The expanded story. The story is told in a longer version. This will help the students understand English when it is spoken faster, as they will now know the story and the vocabulary.
- Vocabulary. Each word in the **Picture Dictionary** is spoken and then used in a simple sentence.

The whistle blows and the Cup Final begins. The players kick the ball, pass the ball, and head the ball to each other.


"Don't touch the ball with your hands!" shouts the coach.

It is a hard game. Both teams play well, but May's team only has ten players.

#### Read and connect.



- The green number one of the yellow team throws the ball to number four. Number four passes the ball to number six. She kicks it to number five and number five passes it to number seven. Number seven kicks the ball to number eight. She passes it on to number eleven. Number eleven heads the ball on to number ten and number ten kicks it into the goal.
- The blue number one of the red team throws the ball to number two. She kicks it to number seven. Number seven passes the ball to number six and she passes it to number eight. Number eight kicks the ball high in the air towards number ten, and she heads it into the goal.



At half time the score is 1–1. The players take a rest and drink some water. In the second half the players play well again. Both teams have good chances to score a goal. Two minutes from the end, Jade passes the ball to May and May kicks it past the goalkeeper into the goal.




